Somaya Hamis ethnic background is part of The Kabyle people. This unique population is a Berber ethnic group indigenous to Kabylia in the north of Algeria, spread across the Atlas Mountains, 160 kilometres (100 mi) east

of Algiers. The area is populated by Kabyles. They speak the Kabyle language, the largest Berber language in Algeria. It is spoken by 3 million people and has significant Arabic, French, Latin, Greek, Phoenician and Punic substratum, with Arabic loanwords representing 35% to 40% of the total Kabyle vocabulary.
